While I wish that Ms. Childs had included an episode that actually covered the hurricane, I am glad that she chose to continue the series. I am thinking that scrapbooking can only go so far as an industry, and that perhaps she needs to have her main character expand her shop to include something more lasting in popularity. It seems that she is edging toward interior design in the past few books. It would be a nice fit. I recently loaned an earlier book (motif for murder) to my friend who grew up in New Orleans. She immediately focused on the scrapbooking aspect, which surprised me. I hope she is not turned off by the voodoo shop aspect represented by Carmella's friend, Ava who owns the fictitious Ju ju voodoo. Since Voodoo does not figure prominently, I don't think she will.
