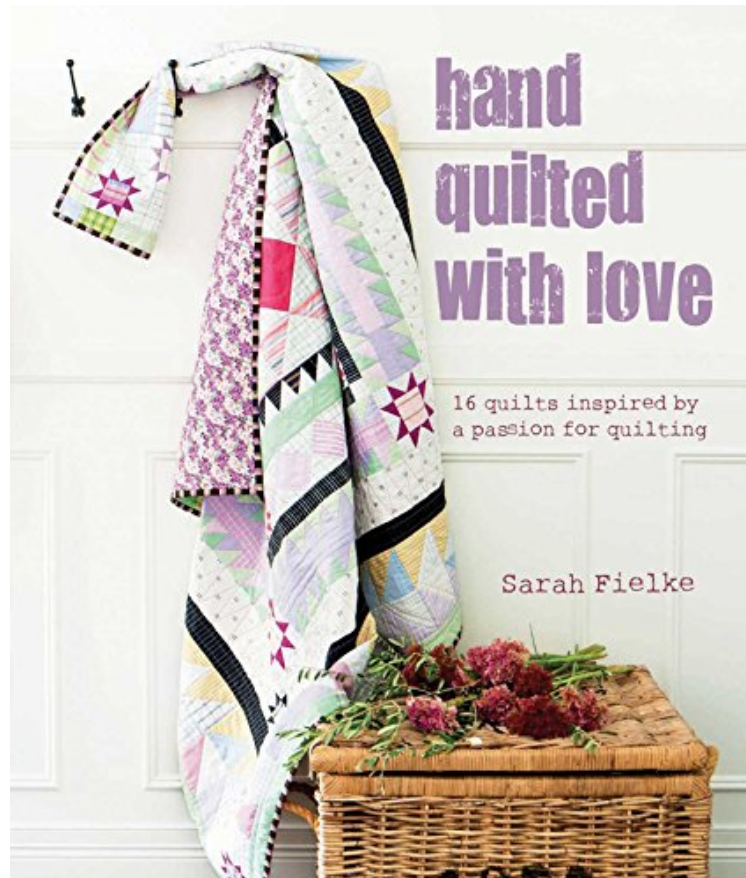

There is a nice "freshness" to the color combinations, and the quilts don't look like each other. Ms. Fielke has a lot of description of the designs, nice directions for assembly, and generally has done a great job creating a quilt book that isn't a replica of others.
