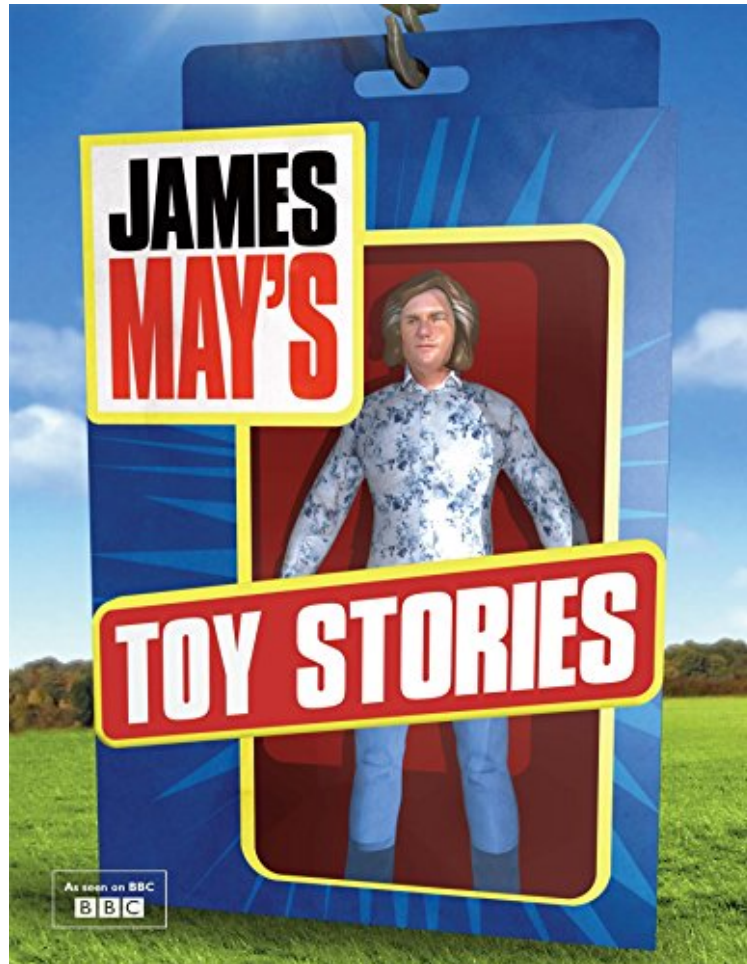

children of all ages, he built a range of classic toys for his popular show.
