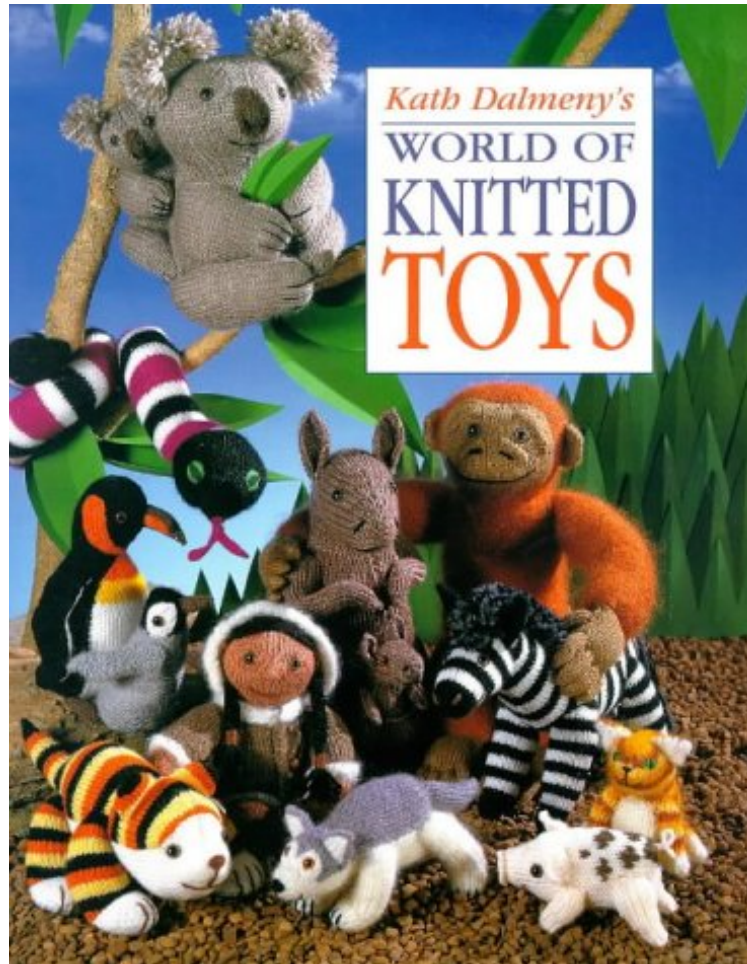

And it has a really interesting selection of animals, not to mention some VERY cute people, too!
