We were looking at the book version on , and then saw that the Kindle edition was only \$2.51. My 11 year old was emptying out her piggy bank to get this book and start on all of her new knitting projects. We got the book, and when she opened it on her Kindle she was very disappointed to find that it was only the panda pattern, not the whole book. When I got back onto , I then could see that when you click on the Kindle edition the picture of the book and title do change, but it is somewhat

subtle if you're not looking for it, and the reviews, description, etc. all stay the same.
