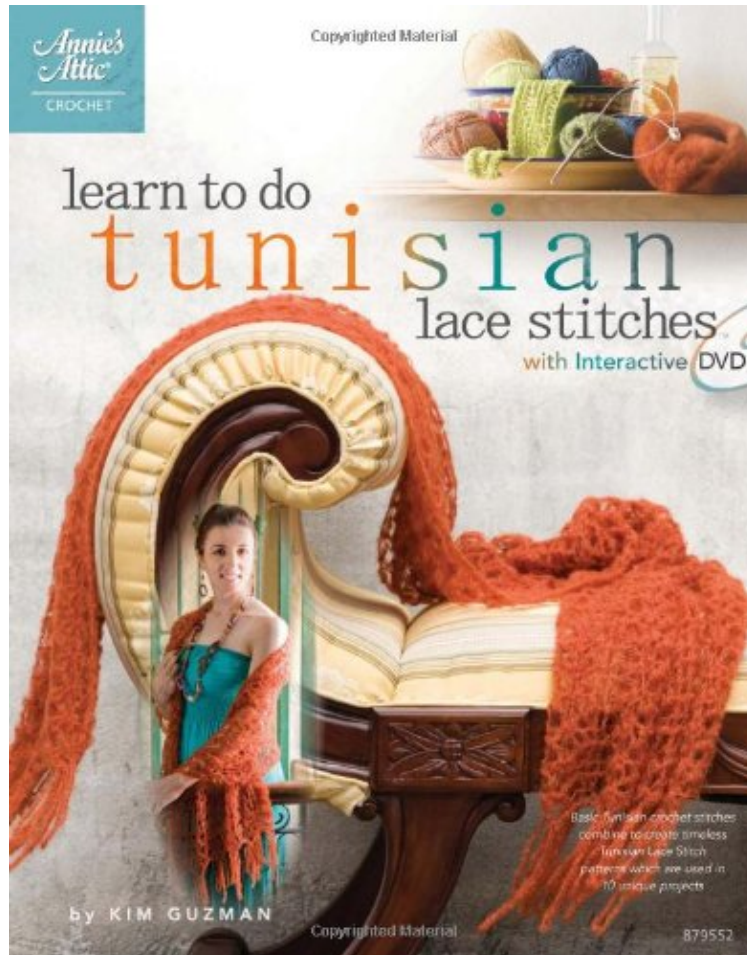

There are plenty of stitches and stitch combinations for both the beginner and the adventurous. This book is not just a resource for learning Tunisian lace stitches, or just a pattern book of lovely Tunisian lace projects, but it is a resource that Tunisian crochet designers will refer back to again and again for both technique refreshers and inspiration. There are only a few stitches, I was hoping for more. Also was hoping for more detailed instructions on Tunisian crochet, I think this book is more for those with some experience. If you're already familiar with Tunisian crochet, you may like this. If, however, you have never done Tunisian crochet and are looking for clear, detailed instructions, this probably isn't for you.

Even if you've never tried Tunisian crochet before, this book is for you. The basic stitches of Tunisian are explained (Tunisian Simple Stitch, Tunisian Knit Stitch, Tunisian Reverse Stitch, etc.) and then those basic stitches are combined into Tunisian Lace stitches created especially for this book.
