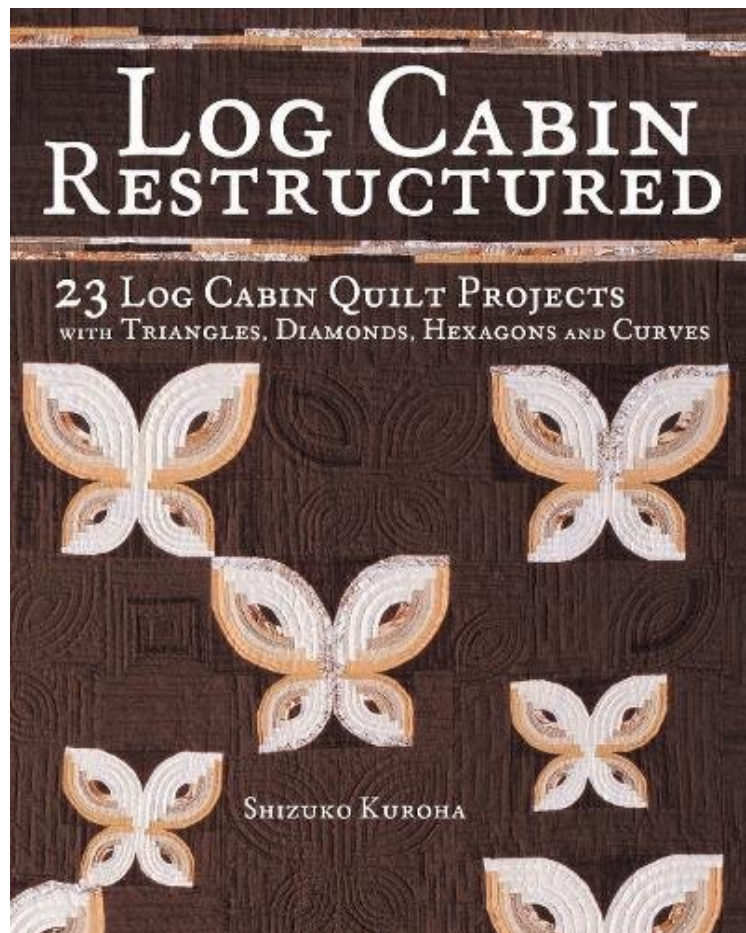

I am a Log Cabin fan, so am always on the look-out for different ways of using the Log Cabin technique. Shizuko Kuroha's re-interpretations of the Log Cabin pattern are

creative, intriguing, and worth the learning curve some of the projects will require. I am not as creative as the author, nor is it easy for me to picture the progression of each step of her instructions (or anyone's instructions, for that matter). But, the end results of the projects are so unique, I want to make the necessary effort to complete most of the projects in the book. The thorough construction instructions aren't as easy to follow as I require, but that's not the author's fault; that's due to my limitations. The photographs are excellent, and the construction drawings are precise, clear, and well-labeled. The author enjoys vintage fabric, primarily indigo, with which I am not the least bit familiar. Many of the pictured projects use that fabric, which I found educational and interesting, but in no way limiting. I look at her projects and picture them using my favorite fabrics. This book offers a versatility of the Log Cabin design I never imagined, but will somehow master. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. Not for beginners...By HelenWhile this book has wonderful ideas for quilts and good paper piecing patterns, American sewers may experience some stumbling blocks. When working with pieces that are cut to size; the Imperial (inches and yards) measurements don't always add up to the size block you need. Double check all the measurements. Also, our group experienced difficulty making the cover block because some of the curves tended to pucker. Japanese quilters exhibit a sewing expertise that is extraordinary and many of us needed more sewing tips and instructions to be successful with the quilt block. shown on the cover.
