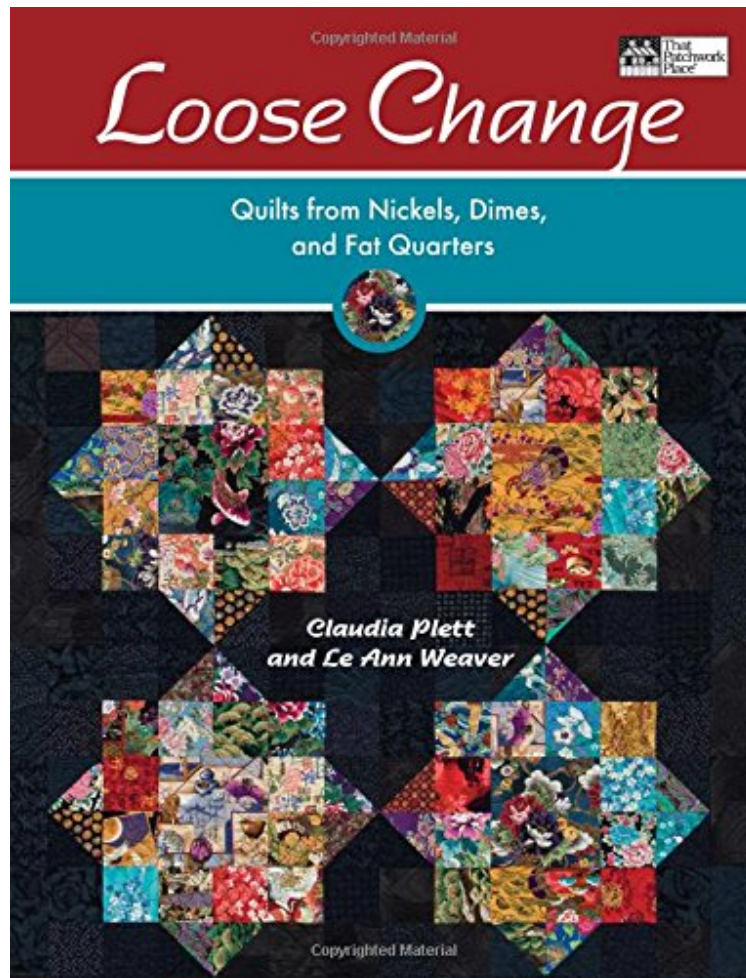

Try a table runner, crib or lap blanket, or even a bed cover. Get up to speed on rotary cutting, traditional and foundation piecing, and easy optional applique and embroidery. Great for fabric swaps or using up your stash.
