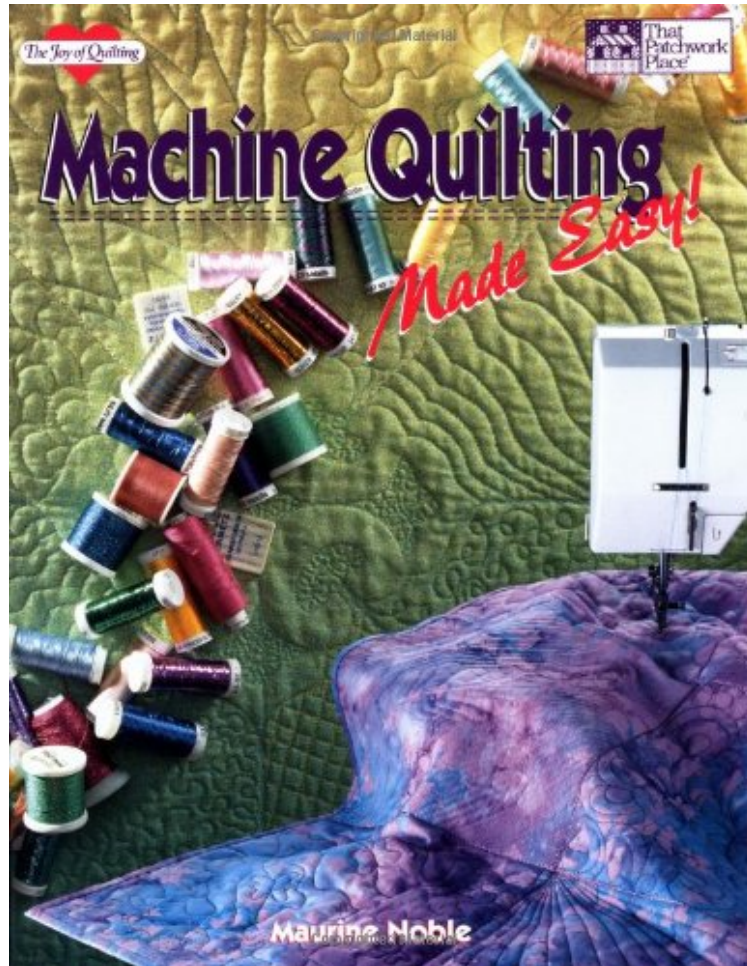

It is really for someone that has had some experience with quilting and wants clarification on certain techniques. This is certainly not for someone just starting out, as much information is touched upon, it is not in depth information and I would think it would leave someone very new to quilting a bit confused.This is a great reference book to pick up and review techniqe and even gives basic information about batting, threads, and needles, but lacks the real essence of doing successful machine quilting. The book's title- Machine Quilting Made Easy- is a bit misleading, as this book at best, glosses over multiple topics on machine quilting-but I am not certain that it really breaks it down in depth enough to qualify as "easy". How much can you possibly learn from 1 page topics really? Machine quilting done properly is not exactly the easiest thing to learn

and given the "shorthand" versions of techniques is not for beginners at all.
