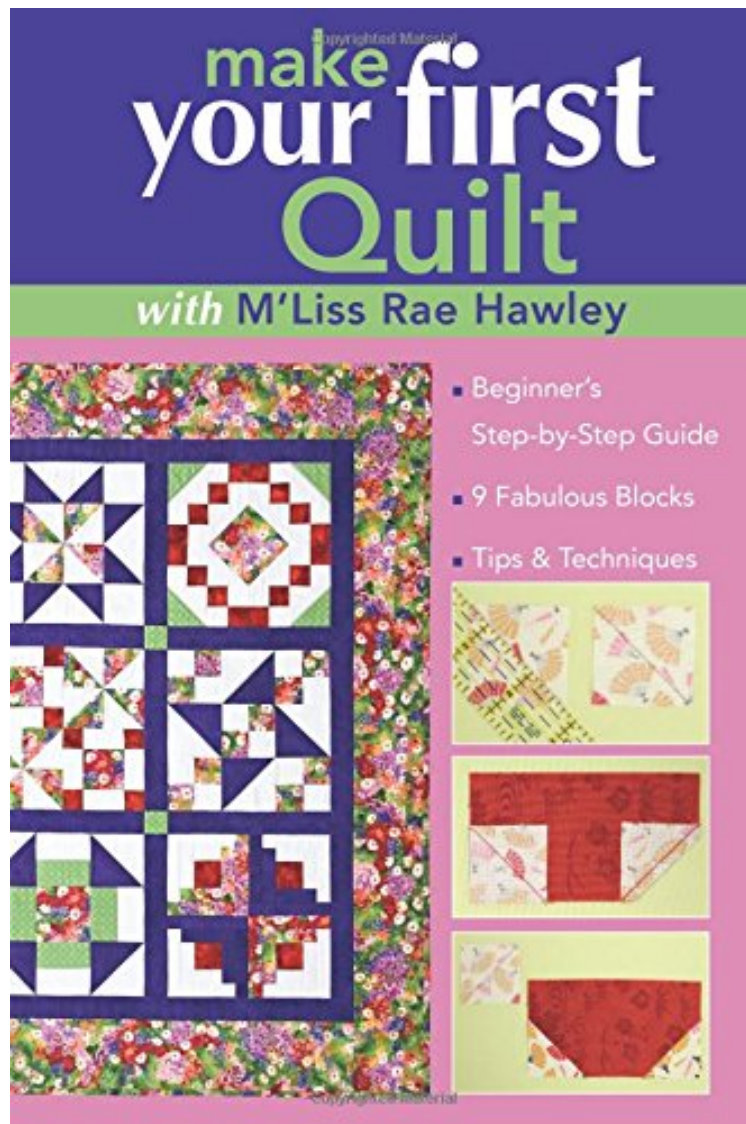

I had never done serious quilting before, she brought me this book and I used it to teach her. I reviewed the book, then we went shopping and I showed her how to interpret the book and select and purchase fabric. I did increase the amounts of fabric we purchased to allow for mistakes and do-overs. Each week I would do a block alone and then teach her to do it. It was fantastic, and where previously I disliked quilting, I have actually changed my mind and plan on doing some items using quilting blocks. This purchase is actually my second, I lost the first book during a move and my client bought me this for Christmas. Since then she has lost her's so I purchased this one to give to her, we are getting ready to do another project. PolhemusBefore I began quilting, I bought a number of quilting books to study. "Make Your First Quilt with M'Liss Rae Hawley: Beginner's Step-by-Step Guide" is one of the best, or, at the least, the one that worked best for me. Why?1. The book is framed in a spiral binding, a must-have feature in a book that will be looked at again and again during the quilting process. It is SO annoying to try to keep a book open and see it flop together over and over. The spiral binding is perfect!2. A close partner: Each plastic (?) coated page is thick and heavy enough to stay put. (If the surface isn't plastic, it is still durably coated.)2. The size is both a positive and a negative. Positive: The 6 x 9 size is small enough to keep right there and not take up too much room, but the size is almost too small to read in a hurry. However, I'm not complaining.3. Content: M'Liss Rae does what most other beginning quilting books do: Lays out very careful processing in order. Even though all of these books label a quilt, I love what M'Liss does: She calls it "Anatomy of a Quilt." Then she explains tools, supplies, fabrics, colors, cutting and piecing, and so on.4. Plenty of photographs or illustrations show exactly what she tells.5. There's a shopping list for the one quilt, the subject of a beginner's quilt, plus a quick note explaining the purpose of each item a second time. It's a good reminder.6. Spread throughout the book at various junctures are quilting tips. Example: "Fabric Grain Guide" and "Safety First with Rotary Cutters."7. And the last which is my favorite: If this is your first quilt, then you will make a Sampler. That means, instead of one repetitive pattern, you, first-time quilter, will make nine different patterns! I love this! That means you will make Triple Rail, Log Cabin, Churn Dash, Waterwheel, Jewel Box, and four others. All those terms are daunting at first. After making nine of these standard blocks, you will know them!8. The colors M'Liss uses in this Sampler are beautiful! What's left? Get this book and get started! In addition, M'Liss Design Fabric was launched for sale in independent quilt shops. In 2009, M'Liss began her wonderful partnership with Hancock Fabrics, producing dozens of fresh, new M'Liss Design Fabric collections every year, as well as other quilting and sewing products. M'Liss's husband, Michael, is in law enforcement and served three terms as the elected sheriff of Island County, Washington. Their son, Alexander, a staff sergeant in the United States Marine Corps, recently returned from Afghanistan.
